(left) **Ten [Kutztown University geology](#) seniors made a great impression on the professional geologist community** at the annual [Pennsylvania Council of Professional Geologists \(PCPG\)](#) conference in Harrisburg last week with [Dr. Kurt Frieauf](#). Many of the professional geologists at the meeting commented on the exceptional number of Kutztown students at the meeting, as well as the high level of enthusiasm and technical competence Kutztown students demonstrated. Every student made formal mentoring contacts with senior professional geologists in the greater Mid-Atlantic States region to help them in their transition from college to career. Students also learned about the process of gaining licensure as a professional

geologist. Geologists are required by law to be licensed by the State Board of Engineers to practice geology outside of academia – much like nurses, doctors, lawyers, accountants, etc. Licensure requires specific college training elements, five years of documented work experience in the field, and competent passage of two national exams.

**Jennifer Cruz awarded a \$1,600 Carole and Ray Neag Undergraduate Research Fund** grant to fund her research project, "A Assay to Identify Tumor Suppressor Genes Turned Off in Cancer Cells." The goal of Cruz's project is to establish whether subtractive hybridization offers a reasonable method for identifying the mutated pathways disrupted in a specific cancer. The purpose of her experiment is to isolate the specific gene or genes that are down-regulated in a cancer versus normal cells of the same tissue from an individual cancer patient. Cruz's ultimate goal for this model is to develop a more personalized treatment of cancer.

**Members of Kutztown University's choral program** will perform Mozart's *Solemn Vespers* on Monday, April 13 at 8 p.m. in Carnegie Hall, New York. The singers will join nearly 200 from colleges and universities across the country. They will be accompanied by the New York City Chamber Orchestra.

**Kutztown University's music department will host Piano Palooza** on Monday, April 27 at 7:30 PM in the Georgian Room of Old Main. The concert will feature pieces for one and two pianos as well as multiple musicians on each instrument. It will include works by Brahms, Debussy, Faure and Chasins. 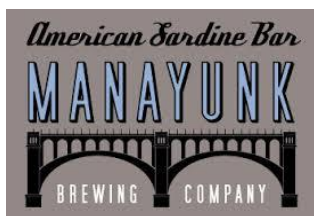
